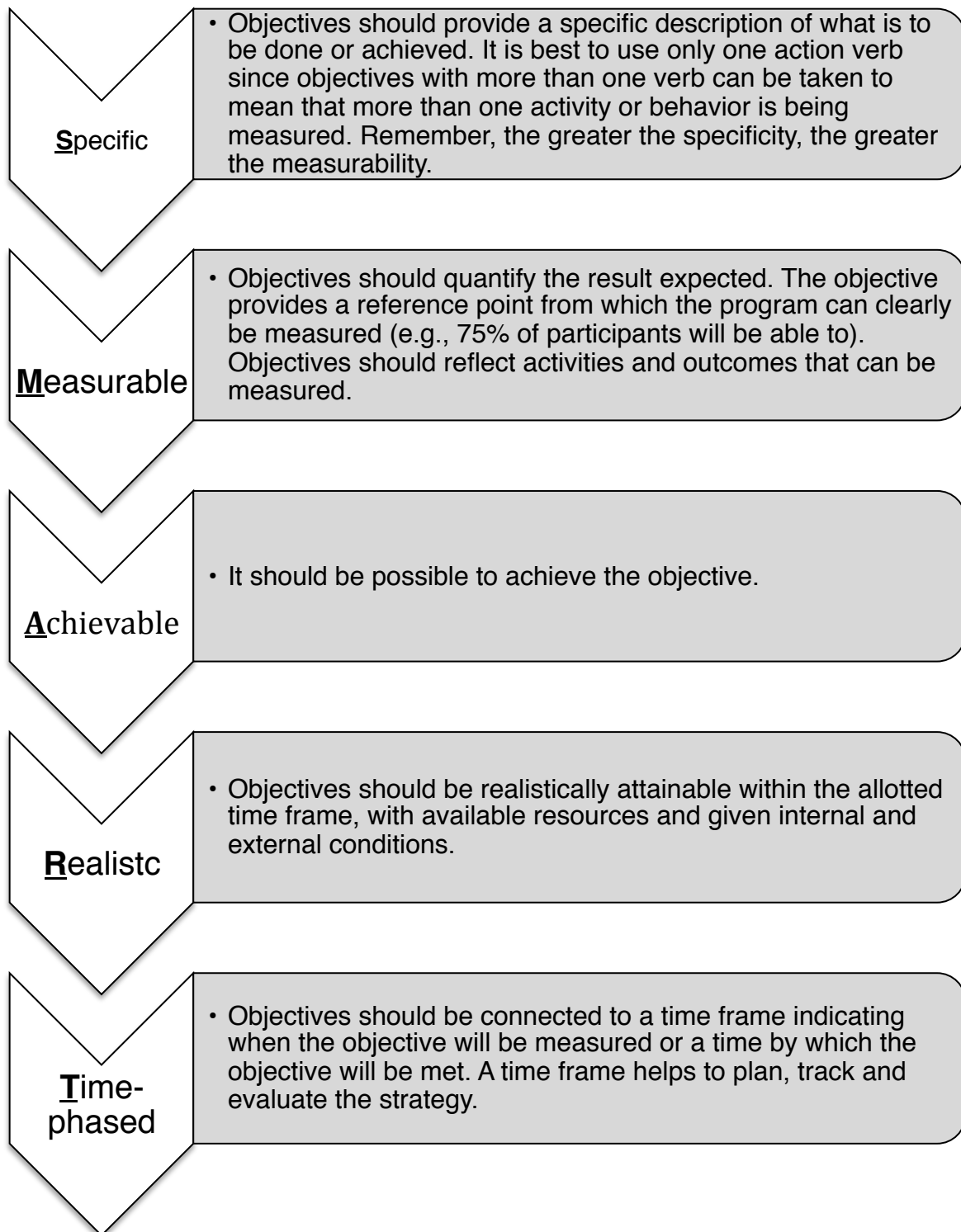




## Creating SMART Objectives



## SMART Objective Worksheet

By October 31, 2013 60 student leaders that participate in the program will be able to demonstrate:

- a. increased knowledge of sexual violence prevention
- b. healthy relationship skills

•Could this objective be more specific?

•How would more specificity make this objective easier to evaluate?

By October 2013, 50% of 1200 high school students that attend at least 6 sessions of an 8 session series will have increased understanding of effective bystander interventions.

•Is this objective measurable?

•How would this be measured?

By October 31, 2013 75% of 100 girls that participate in the girls group will be able to: a. Demonstrate three or more tools to prevent becoming the victim of sexual harassment b. Avoid situations that might involve vulnerability to sexual assault

•Can this objective be achieved?

•Why or why not?

By October 31, 2013 75% of 100 students from 7 high schools that participate a 30 session in school leadership training and 5 off site weekend retreats will be able to demonstrate the active listening, empathetic attunement and emotional validation skills necessary to act as peer counselors.

•Can this realistically be accomplished in an RPE program period?

•How could it be more realistic?



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
